Child Abuse 101: Indicators of Child Abuse & Neglect

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Reporting Abuse or Neglect

Indiana Child Abuse Reports

- Typically there are approximately 200,000+ reports in Indiana annually
- Approximately 25,000-30,000 are substantiated
- Neglect is substantiated the most often 70% to 80% of the time

Child Maltreatment Facilities

- Approximately 1,800 children die nationally from maltreatment (apprx. 5 children per day)
- In Calendar Year 2018, 65 child fatalities were substantiated for abuse or neglect.
- More than 80% are 3 years old and under
- Many more "preventable" deaths

"Typical" Characteristics of Fatalities

- Young children
- Both boys and girls were equally targeted with physical abuse, but more boys died from neglect
- Perpetrators were more often natural parents
- Perpetrators are not always the young, single parent as is often portrayed

Factors Contributing to Child Maltreatment

- The Abuser
- The Child
- Stress/Precipitating factors

Characteristics of Maltreatment

- Substance abuse
- Insufficient income
- Unemployment
- Lack of knowledge/parenting skills
- Family or marital discord/violent relationships
- Many "lack supervision/care" types, e.g. drowning, not being in a car seat, unsafe sleep, guns.

Characteristics of the Child

- No special characteristic
- Physically, developmentally or emotionally disabled
- Special child in the family system

Potential Additional Stressors

- Socially isolated
- Addictions to processes
- Abuse/neglected as a child
- Unmet mental/emotional health issue
- Unstable/overcrowded living conditions

What is Child Abuse?

- "...the child/s physical or mental health is seriously endangered due to injury by the act or omission of the child's parent, guardian, or custodian
- Evidence that illegal manufacture of a drug or controlled substance is occurring on property where a child resides creates a rebuttable presumption that the child's physical or mental health is seriously endangered.

Neglect

...The child's physical or mental health is seriously impaired or seriously endangered as a result of the inability, refusal or neglect of the child's parent, guardian, or custodian to supply the child with necessary food, clothing, shelter, medical care, education or supervision.

Indicators of Neglect include:

• Flat, bald sports on the infant's head

- Poor hygiene/unhealthy
- Torn, dirty or inappropriate clothing for the weather
- Developmental lags
- Underweight

Potential Behavioral Signs of Neglect

- Dull, listless
- Begging/stealing/hoarding food
- Constant fatigue
- Alcohol or drug use
- · Reports of being left alone, abandoned

Common Accidental Injuries

- Facial scratches on babies from long fingernails
- Superficial injuries to the bony prominences
- Forehead and shin bruises

Typical Sites of Inflicted Injury

- Face
- Torso, back
- Neck
- Buttocks, thighs
