The merger could not have come at a more difficult time (or a better time,



more difficult time (or a better time, " depending on one's perspective). The nation was facing unprecedented political, social and racial upheaval. The 1960s brought serious race riots to Watts in 1965 and Detroit in 1967. It brought Woodstock and the drug culture. It also brought the rise of gay and lesbian activism, liberation theology, the Secular City, the Death of God movement, and the Vietnam war. The shooting of Martin Luther King, Jr. and Bobby Kennedy came only days before the Uniting Conference of 1968. Serious riots broke out at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago that summer.

Use your Facebook and other social media sites to help **Promote** our Church

Some people only interact with the Internet though the filter of Facebook, thus it would be a very good idea for members who are active on Facebook and other social media sites to help promote our church.

Here are some suggestions:

- Make a point of regularly (maybe once a week?) posting something about our church.
- Find a relevant page within the church web site. Copy that URL into your post. It should appear within your post with the title or description of the page, and a relevant picture. You can change it to a different picture if you want. And if it doesn't suggest the picture you expect or prefer, let me know which page and what would be a better picture.
- Say something meaningful. Don't just say "My church is nice." Useful posts might be something like "I enjoyed today's sermon about...", "We had a good discussion in our class about ..." or "I'm looking forward to ..."

This will help draw people to our web site, and hopefully through the web site to the church, in multiple ways. First, they see you, their trusted friend, recommending something and they see a picture and a snippet of our web site page. Second, after enough people have done this multiple times, relevant searches within the walled-off Facebook environment may start returning church web site pages as a result. Third, it's possible, for someone connected within Facebook with enough people who have posted a variety of pages (not the main page over and over), then the church web site might start to be offered in the "you might be interested in..." section, replacing the celebrity gossip and rumors normally filling Facebook feeds.

Signs and Symptoms of Mental Health Distress

Signs and symptoms of mental health distress vary by a child's age and developmental maturity. Sudden changes in thoughts and behaviors or the onset of several symptoms rather than just one may indicate a need for mental health services.

The following is a generalized list of feelings, thoughts, behaviors and physical signs that may indicate a child could benefit from professional help regarding a mental health condition.

Feelings:

- Sadness or withdrawal lasting at least two weeks
- Severe mood swings
- Extreme highs and lows
- Intense worries or fears
- Strong anger

Thoughts:

- Strange thoughts (delusions)
- Seeing or hearing things that aren't there (hallucinations)
- Repeated thoughts of death
- Confused thinking
- A desire to badly hurt others

Behaviors:

- Drastic changes in behavior or personality
- Dangerous or out-of-control behavior
- Persistent aggression, temper tantrum or fighting
- Carrying a weapon
- Persistent disobedience or defiance of authority
- Truancy, theft, and/or vandalism
- Dramatic changes in eating or sleeping habits
- Trouble focusing or sitting still
- Using drugs or alcohol
- Social withdrawal; repeated refusal to go to school or take part in normal activities
- Returning to behaviors more common in younger children, such as bedwetting
- Decline in school performance
- Attempting suicide
- Persistent nightmares

Physical:

- A sudden loss of appetite
- Sudden weight loss or gain
- Persistent headaches and stomach aches
- Self destructive behavior such as head-banging, cutting or burning themselves
- Racing heart or fast breathing in association with excess fear or anxiety
- Hyperactivity or fidgeting
- Unexplained physical ailments

Report on Indiana Annual Conference 2018

As your elected lay representative to the Indiana Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, here is a brief report.

General Information:

The budget for 2019 was approved at \$13,149,000. 40% of this goes to general church apportionments and 60% goes to the Indiana Annual Conference.

We received \$680,000 from the sale of retired church properties (mergers or closings). This money will be applied toward new church ministries. The Conference had a goal that by 2020 we will have established 30 new faith communities. We have met the goal 2 years early! Our new goal is to have 30 new faith communities each year.

Thirty four clergy retired this last year and only 23 were commissioned and ordained.

Eighteen churches are scheduled to be closed in this next year (2 in the South District).

Several resolutions were passed which were left over from the 2017 session (came back with changed wording). Two resolutions were on the agenda for this year. The bishop declared one to be unconstitutional and the second was postponed indefinitely.

Mission Information:

Indiana gave 3000 cleaning buckets and 3000 health kits to people in TX, LA, FL and Puerto Rico who had experiences with flooding and hurricanes.

The mission offering taken at the conference for UMCOR totaled \$9,159.

For those who desired to do a mission trip (Guatemala) can do so without gathering a large group. You and join as individuals to another group that is going.

I learned of an organization called SAWS (Servants at Work, Inc.). They provide wheel chair ramps for those in need of one. They provide the tools, plans and materials. They need local volunteers to assemble the ramps. Let the pastor know if this is something that would interest you.

Thank you for allowing me to be your representative to the Indiana Annual Conference.

Where the Spirit Leads, we will follow

Spirit led mission work is a result of the powerful moving of the Spirit. The Spirit takes hold of us and compels us to focus on the mission work of the church. The Spirit moves, compels, urges and directs us in a powerful way. The Spirit also speaks to the people who are the focus of our mission efforts. Through the work of the Spirit, God speaks to people.

Jesus himself is "sent" with a message (Matthew 15:24; Luke 4:18), as is John the Baptist (Matthew 11:10). Jesus, in turn, sends out the twelve with power (Matthew 10) and the seventy (Luke 10:1-20). Or consider Paul's mission to the Gentiles which is a continuation of the work began at the time of his conversion. This is our Christian tradition.

At its most basic level, mission is about conveying a message or carrying out a task. The challenge for the local church is to clearly define the message and the task. What do we want to say, to whom and why do we need to say it? What is our task and how do we accomplish it?

Let's use our youth ministry as an example. Youth spend only a very small amount of time in church activities. Most of their time is with their families. Therefore, the church needs to provide Christian guidance to the parents, and children or youth.

When doing mission work there is an internal and an external component which must be worked on simultaneously. <u>Internally</u>, a church's youth group changes about every 18 months. So when someone "ages out" of the youth group what is the next stage for the young adults? One idea is for the preacher to meet with those in college and their friends once a quarter for a meal. The concept of a traveling preacher is not new to United Methodists. However, more discussion will be needed in our church committees about providing additional spiritual support and contact for these who "age out" of our youth program.

Externally, we need to be reaching out to children and youth in the local community. Why? Consider the problems of suicide, illegal drug addiction and single parent families. The church's counter culture message is very relevant. It is a message of love, hope and understanding what it means to be the family of God. If your heart be as my heart, give me your hand!

The discussions need to begin within our church committees after a time of personal prayer and reflection. Can we break our goals and dreams into small manageable tasks? Seek the Spirit's guidance for the mission work which is before us. Amen.


Missions
