The background of the call into ministry

The multifaceted nature of a clergyperson's roles is usually not clearly defined. The position or role of a clergyperson requires the ability to do several different things well. In this article the focus will be on understanding the background of the call into ministry and the preparation which takes place before the endorsing agency of a particular denomination validates a clergyperson's call.

The Doctrine of the Public Ministry

The term doctrine means what the church believes. The phrase public ministry means wherever the church or a congregation exists, they must have the authority to call, elect and ordain ministers. When Paul founded Christian churches on the island of Crete, he commanded Titus to ordain elders, called bishops, in every city where a church had been established. Elders were ordained specifically to take care of the church of God. They were to feed the church of God, to watch and warn the members and to be examples to their congregations.

The office of public ministry presupposes the spiritual priesthood of all believes. Called ministers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ must themselves be spiritual priests. The ordained elders, in the name of the believers, who have called them, administer the duties and privileges which all Christians have:

- 1. Know & profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior,
- 2. Recognizing God gives to the church apostles, prophets, evangelist, pastors and teachers for the work of ministry,
- 3. Acknowledging scripture states all members should profit from reading scripture, and
- 4. Be ready to give an account of yourself to Christ and the leaders of the church.

However, not all believers may be apostles, prophets, pastors or teachers. So it seems, the ministerial call is a key factor in determining who may be an ordained minister of the Gospel.

The divine call is historically understood as the appointment of a suitable person to the ministry of the church. This person has the right to teach in public, administer the sacraments, and exercise church discipline, made by God or man. (by man in United Methodist terminology this means <u>The Book of Discipline</u>.)

The challenge arises in defining the qualities or skills of a person suitable to the ministry of the church. According to a nationwide survey the three skills laity view as essential for pastors are preaching, management/administration and pastoral care. The three values laity admire in pastors are caring, cooperation and honesty. An effective pastor must have all six of these qualities or skills.

However, there are certain minimum requirements which must be met before a called individual comes before the endorsing agency. They must have a general undergraduate degree and a Master of Theology degree. The risk at this point is even with the proper educational requirements; the endorsing agency may not recognize the individual's call to ministry. Nor does the debt you acquired in obtaining a master of Theology degree influence the endorsing agency's decision. All you can do at this point is put your faith and trust in God.

Hopefully, this article gives you a better understanding of the call into ministry and some of preparation necessary in the United Methodist church to become a pastor in the local church.
