An Outward Sign of an Inward and Spiritual Grace

During our third 18-month cycle (July 2019 to December 2019) the Paoli United Methodist Church was made aware of the concept of food insecurity by one of our members, Dr. Eric Harmon. We already had in place a food pantry donation Sunday, once a month. Each Sunday of the month designates a particular mission need. The third Sunday of the month focuses on providing food for those in need. According to Dr. Harmon, food insecurity occurs for a family or individual when another major expense, like a car needing to be repaired, forces the family or individual to choose between repairing the car or purchasing food. Equipped with this new understanding about the concept of insecurities, congregational members began to use one of their dominant strengths of responding to the changing needs of the Paoli community. They asked the question, what other types of insecurities exist in our community? It was brought to the attention of church leadership; there was a blood insecurity, too. Blood insecurity is based on the need to have a constant and reliable supply of blood on hand at local hospitals. This local supply of blood, sometimes due to heavy demand or to the fact blood can only be stored for a limited period of time, creates uncertainty or insecurity about an available blood supply during times of need. Our church is also working on a third type of insecurity; children's emotional insecurities when they arrive at the Salem Women's Shelter. Our church makes blankets for the children to have when they arrive at the shelter. To help you understand the basics of these various types of insecurity needs, we turn to the Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs. Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs is based on the premise we have to meet basic needs before we can focus on other types of needs. Basic needs are food, clothing and shelter.



As you pray about helping with funeral dinners, consider using a team approach – two or three people working together with the tasks of the dinners broken down into specific, concrete, and manageable parts. For example, one person does the calling, another does the dinner itself, and a third person (or group) does the clean-up. I am sure there are other ways to accomplish this division of labor. It’s up to the coordinators to decide how they would like it done. Sometimes the family may not want a meal and instead they might request food during the funeral visitation.


Over the years, a standardized meal menu has emerged. Hopefully this information will be helpful to any team or class as they pray about our funeral dinner situation.





The Indiana Department of Revenue reminds you to be careful about your personal information. Sensitive information like Social Security numbers, bank accounts, student information, combined with information like your address or where you work can give fraudsters everything they need to steal your identity.

Take note of these tips –

• Store important financial documents in a safe place – bank information & Social Security numbers should be kept in a place where others cannot access them.

• Keep your Social Security card safe – avoid routinely carrying your card in your wallet. That can raise your chances of the card getting lost or stolen.

• Don't over share on social media – thieves look to social media for easy prey. Information like your email address, birthdate and even children's names can be used in a scam.

• Don't leave a paper trail – some identity thieves will go dumpster diving for information thrown out with the trash. Any paperwork with personal information on it should be ripped up or shredded.

• Use firewall or virus software – do your research and make sure you are using a reputable virus scanning software service that can detect when something is wrong.
