#### What is Dementia?

Dementia is a term that encompasses a variety of diseases typically including memory loss, difficulties with communication and language, decrease in ability to focus and pay attention, decline in reasoning and judgment, reduction in visual perception and changes in behavior. There are over a hundred different types of dementia but some of the most common include Alzheimer's, vascular, frontotemporal and Lewy body dementia. Though each specific type of dementia may have a different clinical presentation or course of treatment, dementia (as a general term) is an illness that changes the brain. These changes to the brain often create and inability to think, remember, use good judgment and perform simple tasks. Over time, the disease worsens, sometimes requiring an acute hospitalization to help further evaluate and treat the illness.

#### Support Group

Caring Hands Senior Services sponsors an Alzheimer's Disease & Dementia Caregiver Support Group. This group is open to families, friends, and caregivers of those who are living with dementia. The purpose of the support group is to offer a place to exchange practical information on caregiving problems and solutions; talk through challenges and ways of coping; share feelings, needs, and concerns; and learn about resources available in the community. The support group is held the first Wednesday of each month at Memorial Hospital from 6:30-8:00 PM. Pre-registration is not required. For more information, please call (812) 996-2915.

#### History of the Italian Pasta Dinner

About 4 years ago discussion began within the finance committee about a way to deal with our summer decline in giving. It was agreed the finance committee would sponsor a fundraiser and approval was given by the Administrative Council to proceed. A name for the event was chosen – Italian Pasta Dinner. It would be held the fourth Sunday in September. It would be a free will offering and there would be no takeout. The no takeout was meant to encourage fellowship and bring in others from the community. It was further decided if members of our PUMC youth group acted as servers they would receive 10% of the income from the dinner.

The maitre de would escort the ladies with their families to their tables and the table arrangements & decorations were designed to increase the fellowship experience. This year, the maitre de will be Anthony Bradley. Jackie Bosley will be supervising the kitchen.

In our second year, a survey was given to attendees. The food was rated excellent, the portion sizes were deemed a bit too large for some, wheelchair service was requested, as well as entertainment. In response to these survey requests, the event was adjusted accordingly. Miss Emma Bradley will be singing a few songs and Michael Hannon will be playing his saxophone this year.

About the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2019, the Christian Education committee asked if the youth could receive 40% of the income from the event for their mission trip in March 2020. Approval was given!

A goal of \$4,000 has been set for the Italian Pasta Dinner. This means the youth will receive \$1,600. The general fund will receive \$2,400 which will make up for the short fall in June and July for about 2 of the 6 Sundays when income did not meet expenses.

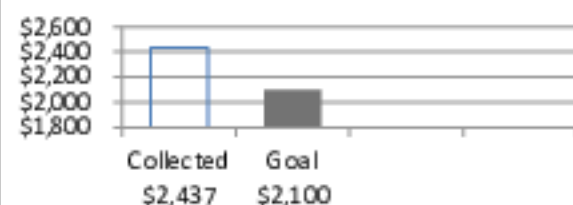

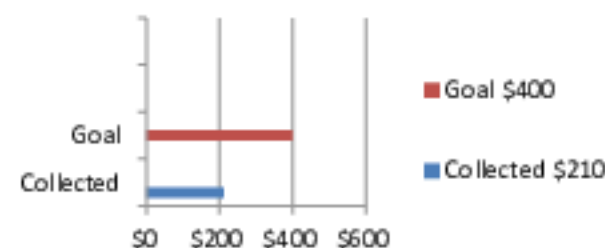

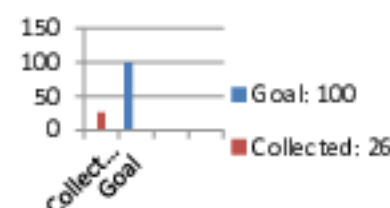

**To Honor Our Veterans: Let Us Never Forget the Veterans of Orange County**

The Paoli Public Library is appealing to you to support a program on which the staff is currently working. The program involves the veterans of Orange County, and the purpose is to honor them in a format that will become a part of the library's genealogical records. The program will be digitized, so that it can be accessed easily through the library's website.

We are trying to reach veterans or their family members to provide information to us that can be incorporated into the program. In addition to factual information, we would appreciate photos or documents for scanning. Examples: Service-connected pictures of vets in uniform, performing their service-connected job, with their buddies, in their surrounding locations while serving, with family, etc.. Also needed are written accounts about their military experiences. There is a questionnaire to complete (see church office). Information for the project needs to be brought to the library by October 31<sup>st</sup>.

The program will be available online for the first time of Veterans Day 2019. The library will also host an appreciation ceremony for the veterans on that day.

### Ten Week Sermon Series on Luke July 21-September 22, 2019

The gospel according to Luke is the first half of the 2 volume set (Luke-Acts), making up about 25% of the New Testament. Luke's Gospel is a proclamation that is preached through the lens of human history.

The Gospel of Luke focuses on the poor and the outcast, women in ministry and what it means to be a witness for Jesus Christ. There are about 1,100 verses in the Gospel of Luke. 280 verses are original to Luke. 250 verses are taken from the Q (source document) and shared with the Gospel of Matthew.

**1 Luke 10:38-42** Martha and Mary contrast each other; Mary's true service is to hear & obey the word of God.

**2 Luke 11:1-13** Luke's account of the Lord's prayer comes from the Q or source document. Luke's form of prayer is probably closer to the original when compared to Matthew's version. Luke indicates prayer will be answered. (v. 9-13)

**3 Luke 12:13-21** How do you invest in your relationships with God? 1. Regular communication through prayer with God. 2. Clearly defining your attitudes & beliefs about God.

**4 Luke 12:32-40** The disciples of Jesus must be faithful servants ready for the return of their Lord. Jesus stresses preparation for the coming Kingdom. A coming which is delayed.

**5 Luke 12:49-56** Luke presents a basic model for understanding judgment by God upon humanity.

**6 Luke 13:10-17** This scripture is unique to Luke. Jesus gives a new doctrine of the Sabbath – it is a time when the work of God is done, repentance declared and salvation offered to the sons & daughters of Abraham.

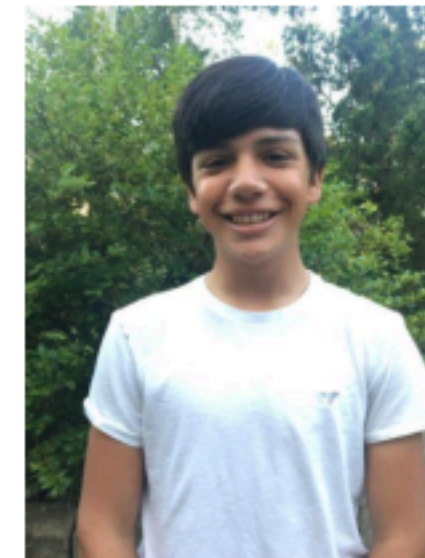
