Dealing with Challenges

We have a dilemma to deal with which is called COVID-19. Medically, it is a "new" virus which seems to impact those over 60 years of age with complicating or complicated medical conditions. This would include, but not limited to, heart or lung conditions and diabetes. This group represents about 1/3 of the general United States population. It is not possible to quarantine such a large group of people.

We do not know a whole lot about the virus, except it moves very quickly through populations and seems to be transmitted by saliva droplets. Put another way, when we talk, we spit. Hence the social distancing and mask wearing requirements by our government health officials. The medical dilemma is can we produce a vaccine for COVID-19 in less than the 2 years it normally takes to make and test - with vaccine effectiveness rate of over 65% for the general population of the United States?

On the other side of the dilemma, it would be naïve to assume we can be quarantined for one or two years until a vaccine is developed. On the local level, from your pastor's perspective, when can our church be opened up again for in-person worship and fellowship? Based on discussions with the trustees and worship committees, we will open on Sunday, July 5 with 2 services at 8:15 & 10:15, and Wednesday, July 8 at 6 PM. Each service will meet in the Fellowship Hall with a maximum attendance of 15 people per service. Attendees will have to sign up in advance.

Since it will be challenging to predict the future with accuracy, we ask our membership to exercise their own best judgement as to attend or not attend our worship services. We will keep you updated with our weekly church e-mails. We will continue to record on YouTube, Instagram and Facebook weekly. It will be an ongoing process of adjustments as new medical information is available and a consistent process of cleaning/sanitization before, during and after each worship service.

Be wise, pray and reflect on your own risk assessment and act responsibly. much like the Bible verses from Proverbs listed at the top of this article suggests.
