Ecclesiastes 7:25

[I turned my mind to know and to sear out and to seek wisdom and the sum of things, and to know that wickedness is folly and that foolishness is madness.]

As the last month of 2020 begins the Trustees' major focus has been on infrastructure improvement for the parsonage and the church. This should not come as a surprise, because the church building is approaching 50 years of service. The parsonage is slightly older than the church. However, the parsonage had a renovation down to "the studs" 25 to 30 years ago.

Jim Faulkner is the current Trustee Treasurer. He is using a five-year projection of income and expenses as one way to avoid financial "spikes" of expenses in any one year.

The financial budgeting by the Trustees is going or has already become complicated for 2021 and 2022 as we prepare to make our church facility ready to celebrate the 49th and fiftieth years of service to the Lord!

There are always unexpected expenses in any given year. This year one of the expenses was the repair of our flag pole, worked on by David Foster & Kevin Mills. Several attempts were made before success was achieved. If you want more information on this project, talk to David or Kevin.

Behind the scenes support by Duane Radcliffe is much appreciated. He walks through the whole church on a weekly basis. Duane discovered the Northeast side of the church building was sagging. He alerted the Trustees to this problem. Thanks, Duane!

One of the unspoken rules which guides the action of the Trustees is we want our church to look nice as one way of showing respect to our God. As we prepare to celebrate our fiftieth anniversary, the old tree on the South side of our church property has died. It needs to be cut down and the stump ground down. Seems like a project which is easy to handle? However, at the November Trustees meeting commitments to our church parking lot had already been approved and a contractual agreement was signed. So, we pushed some projects back several years and made budgeting cuts in 2021.

It was decided to ask the congregation for financial help in cutting down the tree. The price is \$800.00. If you wish to donate, please mark "cut tree" on the memo line of your check.

As with any dynamic process, things will continue to break down and the Trustees will continue to repair or replace as needed. The Trustee committee includes: Jennifer Austin, Frank Barnett, Diane Dillard, Jim Faulkner, David Foster, Darlene McBride and Kevin Mills.

How are you living?

I Thessalonians 5:1-11, Matthew 25:14-30 by Howard Detweiler

A fascinating topic for many people: when will the second coming of Christ occur? You have witnessed various dates and time periods, I am certain. The young church at Thessalonica had some questions about this issue which Paul tries to address in this letter.

The Day of the Lord. Many see it as doom and gloom, judgment. We are frequently warned in scripture that Christ's return will be quick, without warning, and totally unexpected. Are you ready? This question applies to all of us. But Paul goes beyond the question of readiness to the more important question. How are you living while you wait for this event?

In Matthew's gospel we have a clue as to what we should be doing while waiting. It is a parable about the kingdom of God. A business owner leaves on an extended business trip. He calls in three managers and gives each of them tools that they can use to carry on the business. The tools are not given equally but based on their needs. When the owner returns, he calls in the managers to hear their reports. Two managers report great success, doubling and tripling their production. One manager, however; had disappointing results. He had excuses and even blamed the owner for the problem. The bottom line was that he did not use the tool given to him. Why? He felt slighted? He wanted to try his way? The tool given him was worthless? He didn't trust the owner? This manager was fired and did not share in the success of the other managers.

We are the interim managers until Christ returns. The business is the kingdom of God/the church. The tools given to us are the spiritual gifts. One gift all Christians receive is the Holy Spirit: the presence of God living with us, the presence of God working in us, the presence of God guiding us. Paul says this (I Cor. 12:7), "A demonstration of the Spirit is given to each of us for the common good". Everyone has the Holy Spirit and is expected to be using its power.

None of the speculations regarding the timing of the second coming are important. As Christians we do believe in Christ's coming again. If we are ready (believers in Christ) we will not be surprised when He returns. Our focus should be on how we are living and preforming now.

Paul urges us to use self-control, use our faith, our love, our hope, and the Holy Spirit while we are waiting. Are you currently using the gifts given to you by God for the advancement of His kingdom? How are you living now?



Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit, in the Bible, refers to the way in which God is known and active in the world, in human history and particularly in the history of Israel and the church. Sometimes the reference is to the Spirit of God or in the New Testament to the Spirit of Jesus. Christians understand the Holy Spirit in relation to God as Trinity. God is known in three ways: as creator, redeemer, and sustainer or sanctifier. The work of sustaining (empowering) and making holy (sanctifying) is that of God the Holy Spirit. The idea of the Trinity is more easily understood as a description of how God acts than as a definition of God. The Holy Spirit is not a separate power but an expression of God. Whatever is done by the church in Christian education rests on and is shaped by belief in the Holy Spirit and the willingness to be open to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. Its essential task is to bring individuals into the fellowship of the church where they may hear God's call to them in Jesus Christ and may learn what it means to live all of life as children of God. This is a magnificent responsibility, and the church that accepts this responsibility wholeheartedly will find itself fulfilled by the power of the Holy Spirit.
